

(B) Nothing herein shall be construed to create any liability on the part of the employer, unless the employer is the sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender, in any civil action to recover damages for injury, death or loss to person or property allegedly caused by any act or omission relating to this section.

(C) If an offender is required to register pursuant to division (A) of this section or sections 2950.04 and 2950.041 of the Ohio Revised Code, the offender, at least twenty (20) days prior to changing the offender's residence address and not later than five (5) days after changing the address of the offender's place of employment, during the period which the offender is required to register, shall provide written notice of the residence or place of employment address change, as applicable, to the Upper Arlington Chief of Police.

(D) If a person to whom division (A) of this section applies violates division (A) or (C) of this section by failing to register or failing to notify of a change of address with the Upper Arlington Chief of Police, that person is guilty of failing to register or failing to notify of a change of address, a misdemeanor of the first degree.

(E) The determinations and intent articulated in section 2950.02 of the Ohio Revised Code are hereby adopted.

(F) The provisions in Chapter 2950. of the Ohio Revised Code, which are now or hereafter in effect concerning the definition, determination, registration, or classification of a person who has been convicted of, is convicted of, has pleaded guilty to, or pleads guilty to either a sexually oriented offense that is not a registration-exempt sexually oriented offense or a child-victim oriented offense and has been classified as a sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender are hereby adopted.

§507.18 RESIDENTIAL AND EMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS FOR SEXUAL PREDATORS, HABITUAL SEX OFFENDERS, SEXUALLY ORIENTED OFFENDERS OR CHILD-VICTIM ORIENTED OFFENDERS; INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

(A) No person who has been convicted of, is convicted of, has pleaded guilty to, or pleads guilty to either (1) a sexually oriented offense that is not a registration-exempt sexually oriented offense (for a crime committed against a child) or (2) a child-victim oriented offense; and who has been classified as either a sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender as to either (1) or (2) above, shall establish a residence or occupy residential premises or be employed within one thousand (1,000) feet of any school premises, licensed daycare facility, preschool, any public park, swimming pool, library, or playground.

(B) Nothing herein shall be construed to create any liability on the part of the employer, unless the employer is the sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender, in any civil action to recover damages for injury, death or loss to person or property allegedly caused by any act or omission relating to this section.

(C) If a person to whom division (A) of this section applies violates division (A) by establishing a residence or occupying residential premises or being employed within one thousand (1,000) feet of any school premises, licensed daycare facility, preschool, any public park, swimming pool, library, or playground, the Upper Arlington City Attorney has a cause of action for injunctive relief against the person. The City of Upper Arlington shall not be required to prove irreparable harm in order to obtain relief.

(E) The provisions in Chapter 2950. of the Ohio Revised Code, which are now or hereafter in effect concerning the definition, determination, registration, or classification of a person who has been convicted of, is convicted of, has pleaded guilty to, or pleads guilty to either a sexually oriented offense that is not a registration-exempt sexually oriented offense (for a crime committed against a child) or a child-victim oriented offense and has been classified as a sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender, are hereby adopted.

§507.19 COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS; MEGAN'S LAW.

(A) Within five (5) business days of receiving a registration or notice as described in C.O. §507.17 or section 2950.11 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Upper Arlington Police Department shall deliver notification containing the information required in section 2950.11(B) of the Ohio Revised Code to the occupant or owner of each residential dwelling unit, commercial or other unit within one thousand (1,000) feet of the address of the residence of the sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender or the address where the sexual predator, habitual sex offender, sexually oriented offender or child-victim oriented offender is employed as defined in C.O. §507.01 as the said address is set forth in the registration or notice. The notification shall also be delivered within any additional geographical area or areas adopted by the Ohio Attorney General pursuant to section 2950.13 of the Ohio Revised Code. The delivery may be accomplished by hand carrying, mailing a copy, by conspicuously posting a copy at each dwelling, commercial or other unit or by electronic notification.

(B) A copy of any notice shall be maintained by the Upper Arlington Chief of Police and forwarded to the Clerk of Council for posting where the Clerk of Council posts ordinances for publication.
